I very much regret that there has been this delay in acknowledgment of your very kind and I may say staggering typescript of your work "The Unknown Bible". What I had in mind to send you from my little assembly of "Flat Earth" literature, seems now something very lowly in comparison. But I feel that so many are merely intrigued and do not appreciate that they will be brought up very sharply to face the statements of The God of Israel. Will you please give me your prayerfully guided opinion- should a subscription charge be made, or slowly peg away as now.

I regret that I have been so long in writing to you but as you may imagine, I have been swamped with interviews and a vast amount of correspondence. Much distorted, slanted and some lying reporting resulted in many newspapers all over the world. The resulting flood of letters is still on even today. One interesting letter came from a government scientist giving the White House, Washington D.C. address. Also there is a group of Indians. Last Monday the 3rd. I had an BBC, TV. Interview with Patrick Moore. The film will be shown 'ay' 10.

During all this period and the strain of dealing with the many phone and personal interviewers I felt it very much that no one of the Society gave me the slightest encouragement knowing that the N.A.S.A. people and all scientists were rejoicing at our seeming defeat by the Moon orbit. Since writing overleaf matter on Feb.7, I have had a very bad setback in health. Several times I really thought I could not pull through. Doctors urgent treatment and the constant aid by my wife has enabled me to get an hour or sometimes less of sleep. Therefore while I'm feeling a little easier I hasten to continue your letter; but as you see I wish to advise you that the thoughts that I had regarding a meeting must be stalled for some time.

I am sending you the small but useful booklet "Is The Earth A Whirling Globe" which I trust will be of help. Kindly let me have it back before the end of March. I have been given permission to reproduce the book and want to make additions dealing with modern MOON and space shots etc. There is always an insistent, urgent, demand for literature from all over the world; but how we shall ever raise enough money for a reasonable edition seems beyond hope at present.

Over this bad period I have had to discontinue interviews. The last booked is for this Wednesday, I hope that I can make it. If you come across newspaper or other reports ...and there have been many all over the world, please try to find what I said as opposed to that which I am stated to have said. Many false reports have gone out. However, one of the more truthful has appeared in The Illustrated London News of Feb: 8.

I have one or two thoughts about Norman's Moon venture and what I take to be the Godless presentation on last Christmas Day '68 and the deceptive use of the Bible Ch:1.

Since receiving your long awaited letter of January 10, a beautifully long report for which I am indeed deeply grateful to you, I too have been experiencing additional trouble of continued heart condition and, believe it or not, age! Therefore I can readily sympathise with you having been under the medicals with your bout of pleurisy.

Regarding the work as secretary; there are times, all too often, as after the Apollo 8 very doubtful event, when I fully realise my inability to cope with the multitude of correspondence and enquiries plus the sniggering, slanted, press correspondents and work writers (so-called). But one rather bright spot I'll mention later.

To return to your letter. Your deep interest in Solar Eclipses and their shadow tracks across the earth, brought me rather violently back to the point of study which, owing to the mass of other work mentioned above I have perforce neglected- but which actually was a major point in forcing me out before the public, some Universities and some Professors. I enclose an official pamphlet of the "Total Solar Eclipse of 1954 June 30". I feel sure that you will, if you have not already worked over it, enjoy the evident display of official ~~stark~~ admission of faulty globular theory. I have demonstrated the falsity of this eclipse timing many times and have never been disproved when diurnal rotation and globularity is shown to be false. With your own Siberian findings together with this 1954 gives us wonderful factual strength! The challenge is:- To get the first of the eclipse (on Globe) mid N/America. (2) Over B/Isles Midday. 3) Final sighting Jodhpur or BHOW equator/Indian ocean. I play trick on listeners; directing their attention FIRST to India. "could 'they' purposely want to conceal the truth"? "what would they gain"?
